


Basic information

- Jędrzejów is a town in the south- east of Poland. There are about 16, 139 inhabinants. The name is probably after a man named Andrzej, a member of the noble Lis family. There are some interesting sights to visit here. For example:
- The Przypkowski Museum
- The Cistercian Monastery
- The old railway stations with an antique

THE PRZYPKOWSKI MUSEUM

• It was opened in 1962 as a state run museum. It began as a clock collection of the Przypkowscy family and is focused on sundials and optical astronomical instruments. The museum collection is known all over the world.



THE CISTERCIAN MONASTERY

The Cistercian Monastery in Jedrzejów was founded in 1140 by the family of Jaksa - Gryfit, who brought monks from Morimond in Burgundy. The town of Jedrzejów grew around it. Blessed Polish bishop of Kraków and historian, Wincenty Kadłubek, lived in the monastery and the sculpor Veit Stoss (Polish Wit Stwosz) worked there.

Now you can go on one day trip by the antique train and admire the most beautiful contryside around




The park Zalew
