Howard Castle

This beautiful castle took over 100 years to build to completion, and contains several gardens on its premises. A large portion of it was destroyed in a fire in 1940, but it was rebuilt and the castle has been used as a filming location for several movies.

Kilkenny Castle

Kilkenny Castle is castle in Kilkenny in Ireland built in 1195. It was a symbol of Norman occupation and in thirteenth-century condition it was have formed an important element of the defences of the town with four large circular corner towers and a massive ditch. In present in the castle basement, visitors can see very beautiful art exhibition.

Warwick Castle

Warwick Castle is situated in the town of Warwick, on a sandstone bluff at a bend of the River Avon. It is a medieval castle developed from a wooden fort, originally built by William the Conqueror during 1068. According to legends, the first fortifications were built in 914 by Ethelfleda who was daughter Alfred the Great.

Dover Castle is a medieval castle in Dover, Kent, England. It was founded in the 11th century and has been described as the "Key to England". Massive rebuilding took place at the end of the 18th century during the Napoleonic Wars. After the outbreak of the Second World War in 1939 saw the tunnels converted first into an air-raid shelter and then later into a military command centre and underground hospital.

Ashford Castle

Ashford Castles was built in Ireland on the perimeter of a monastic site in 1228 by the Anglo-Norman de Burgo. Castle has been used as a set for "French Court" in The CW's hit medieval drama *Reign*. The castle and surrounding grounds figure prominently in the first three seasons of the drama, with the cast and crew returning on a yearly basis to film on the estate. This castle has turned into a five-star hotel with over 800 rooms for guests.

Ballindalloch Castle

Also known as the "Pearl of the North" in Scotland. Ballindalloch Castle is only open to tourists during the summer months. It is said to be haunted by several ghosts, who sometimes appear to visitors.
